The University of Hawaii Cancer Center announces the availability of graduate research fellowships in cancer disparities research. Current master's and doctoral students at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa are invited to apply for a graduate assistantship made available by the Pacific Island Partnership for Cancer Health Equity (PIPCHÉ). This is a cancer research, training and outreach program in partnership with the University of Guam, funded by the National Cancer Institute's Center to Reduce Cancer Health Disparities. Previously awarded fellows will be considered pending the availability of funds. Initial appointment is for one semester but extensions are possible with satisfactory performance.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- ✓ U.S. citizen, U.S. National, permanent U.S. resident, or citizen of one of three U.S. Compact Nations (FSM, RMI, ROP)
- ✓ Admitted to a relevant doctoral or master's program at the University of Hawai'i
- ✓ Suitable mentor who is a University of Hawai'i faculty member with experience in cancer research
- ✓ Interest and/or dissertation/thesis topic related to cancer health disparities in the Pacific
- ✓ Students of Pacific Island ancestry and/or students with significant experience (7 or more years) in the Pacific region will be granted priority
